

We pay a press clipping service for the use of press clips. Do we have to report other activity outside the press clipping licence to CAL?

Many departments have direct licensing agreements with press clipping suppliers, such as Media Monitors and AAP. Depending on the terms of your subscription, this licence may cover all of your newspaper clipping activity, so you should check your licence agreement first or talk to your press clipper to see what is covered.

Where you do not have a direct licensing agreement with a press clipping service, or where your department performs activity beyond the scope of that licence, the Statutory Licence agreement between your department and CAL requires that you report that activity under the Commonwealth Agreement.

What activities need to be reported directly to CAL?

- print copying of clips, such as making multiple hardcopies of press clips;
- scanning of hardcopy clips;
- digitally distributing, via email or intranet, where a 'downstreaming' licence is not in place with a press clipping supplier; and
- digital archiving for more than 90 days.

How do we report activity to CAL?

CAL will email you a Distribution and Communication of Newspaper Clips survey that you are required to complete on a quarterly basis. Once you have returned the survey detailing any additional activity, an invoice will be sent to your department.

Can we send newspaper clips to other organisations?

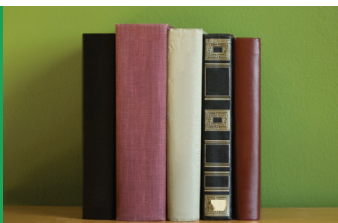
Yes, the licence covers distributing hardcopy clips to external bodies.

Can I store clips on my computer for longer than 90 days?

If you need to store clips for longer than 90 days, this can be done under the Commonwealth Agreement, however you need to notify CAL directly using the contact details below.
